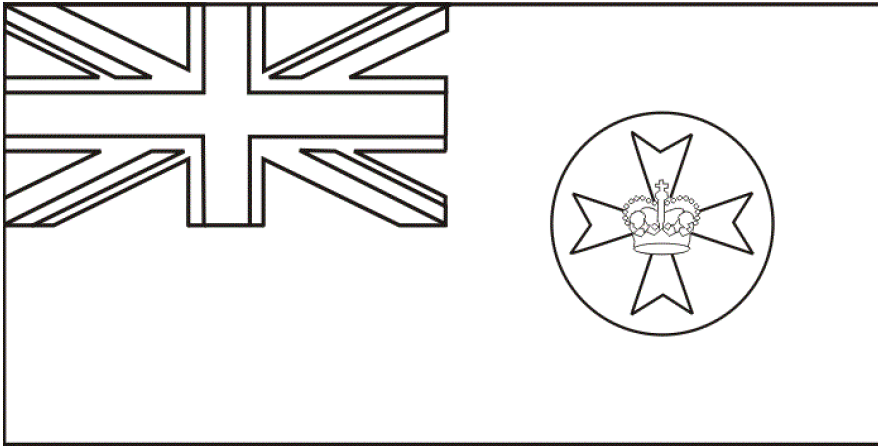


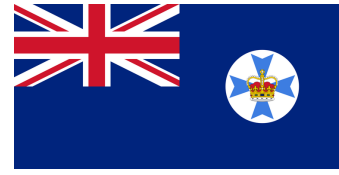
Flags of Queensland

Here are **three** of the flags that hang in the Legislative Assembly Chamber. Which is the *fourth* flag?*

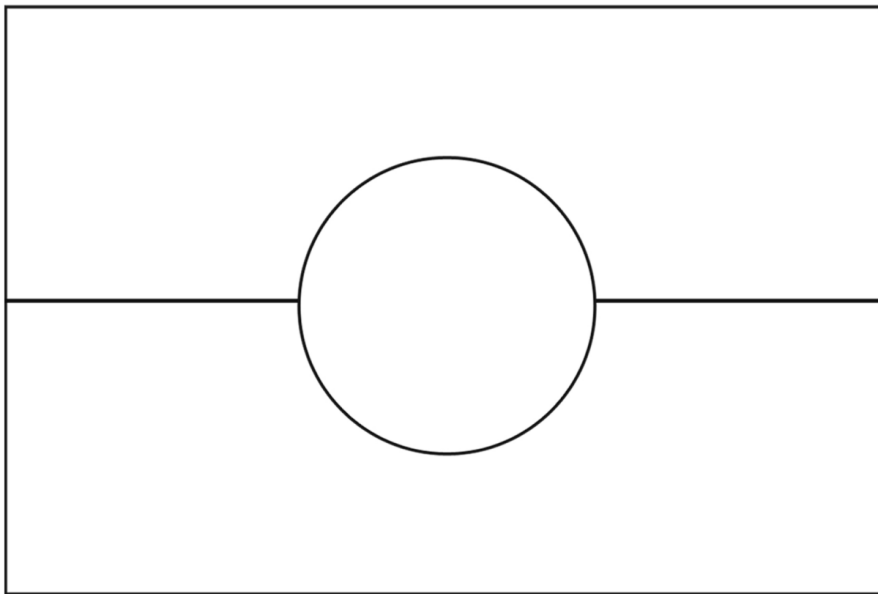
Colour the flags below with the correct colours.



Flag of Queensland



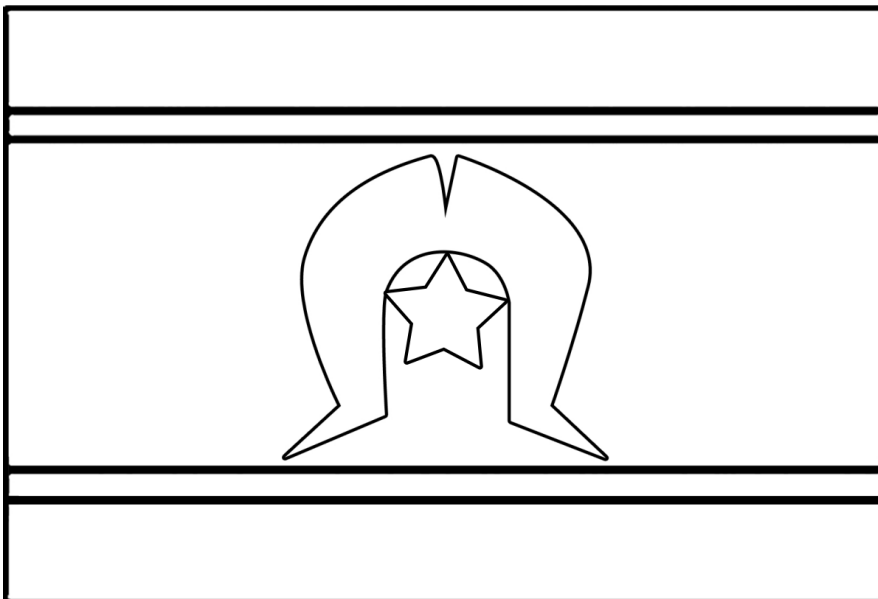
Our state flag was first introduced in 1876. It has the Union Jack and the badge of Queensland. The state badge has a maltese cross and a crown.



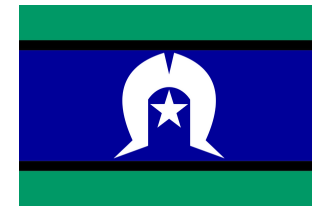
Aboriginal Flag



Black is for Aboriginal Peoples.
Red is for the earth and the red ochre used in ceremonies.
The yellow circle is for the sun.
This flag represents Aboriginal Peoples and their strong, spiritual connection to the land.



Torres Strait Islander Flag



Green is for the land. Blue is for the sea.
The black stripes are for the Torres Strait Islander People. The white headdress is a Dhari. The star is important in navigating the seas. It has five points to represent the five island groups in the Torres Strait.
This flag was adopted in 1992.
