Some students will have a non-speaking or scripted role (no prior preparation required).

- Youth Leader of the House—in addition to their speech they will provide a vote of thanks (this is scripted, no prior preparation needed).
- Youth Government Whip—in additional to their speech, the Whip reads two scripted lines (no practice or prior preparation needed).

Key Roles

- Youth Leader of the Opposition

- Youth Opposition Whip —in additional to their speech, the Whip reads one scripted lines (no practice or prior preparation needed)

Vision for Queensland

This speech is only given by the Youth Premier and Youth Leader of the Opposition.

It asks the student to explore the question—What Queensland will you create as a leader?

Introduced by the **Youth Shadow Minister for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships**, this motion will ask the House to support the following:

Speaker, I move that this Parliament place on record its appreciation of the contribution made to our State and nation by various celebrated Indigenous Australians.

The celebrated Indigenous Australian the students will speak on comes from the name of their seat. For example, the Youth Member for Yagmoor will speak on Peter Yagmoor, celebrated AFL player.

Government Motion

Introduced by the **Youth Minister for Sport**, this motion will ask the House to support the items below.

Speaker, I move that this Youth Parliament supports the following provisions to promote equality in sport:

- 1. All Year 6 students from South East Queensland will attend a school sports carnival, competing against Far North Queensland Schools, to be held each year in Townsville or Cairns;
- 2. At least one State of Origin game will be played in Far North Queensland each year;
- 3. From 2025, all players in the NRLW competition will be paid at the same rate as the NRL players.
- 4. Cairns to have a professional AFL team to compete in the AFL & AFLW competitions.

A Opposition Youth Member may say: Cairns lacks the infrastructure and population to ensure a professional AFL team will be successful long term.



Private Members' Statement Adjournment Debate

Think of this as a free choice topic!

Students speak on <u>any</u> topic or issue that falls within either the:

- Queensland jurisdiction i.e. School, Environment, Health, Roads, Law and Order etc.
- Local jurisdiction i.e. Street, Suburb, Playround, Park, Library etc.

In the past students have spoken about the high cost of fresh fruit and vegetables, youth crime, speed limits on roads, lack of school resources or facilities, scooters and e-bikes, an endangered animal, homelessness, the Brisbane Olympics, natural disaster assistance, bullying, public transport etc.

Speech preparation tips

- Do not use palm cards.
- Print the speech on A4 paper—use large, easy-to-read font.
- Write the seat name at the top (i.e. Youth Member for Yagmoor).
- Focus on 1 key point.
- Start with:
 - Speaker, I rise to speak on...
 - Speaker, I rise to inform the House...
 - Speaker, I draw the attention of the House...
- Conclude with *Thank-you*, *Speaker*.
