Some students will have a non-speaking or scripted role (no prior preparation required).





Vision for Queensland

This speech is only given by the Youth Premier and Youth Leader of the Opposition.

It asks the student to explore the question—What Queensland will you create as a leader?

Government Motion—moved by Youth Minister for Education

Speaker, I move that this Youth Parliament supports the following provisions to improve the facilities and learning outcomes of Queensland primary schools:

- That all students in Years 5 and 6 be taught how to prepare at least five simple and healthy meals for breakfast, lunch, or dinner, as part of their regular school learning.
- 2. That every primary school have access to a 25-metre swimming pool and a 100-metre running track, either on school grounds or within a 5-minute walk, to encourage fitness and outdoor activity.
- 3. That all students be provided with a sit-stand desk in classrooms to support healthy posture and focused learning throughout the day.
- 4. That primary schools move to a four-day school week, with school days finishing at 4:30pm, to allow more time for creative activities, sport, rest, and family.

A Government Youth Member may say: Learning how to cook a simple and healthy meal from a young age will help us know what foods are good for our bodies.



A Opposition Youth Member may say: We already have lots of subjects, and adding cooking might take time away from learning other important skills like subtraction or reading.



Opposition Motion—moved by Youth Shadow Minister for Science and the Environment

Speaker, I move that this Parliament supports the following provisions to improve awareness of Queensland's endangered wildlife, flora and environment:

- 1. That all primary schools in Queensland be provided with both recycling and compost bins, and that compost made at school be used in school gardens.
- 2. That all cats sold or adopted in Queensland must be desexed unless the owner is a registered breeder, to help protect native wildlife.
- 3. That Queensland introduce a refund scheme where people can return captured cane toads to local councils or wildlife centres and receive a small reward to help control this invasive species.
- 4. That every primary school be given a financial subsidy to take Year 5 and 6 students on a science excursion to one of Queensland's World Heritage sites such as the Great Barrier Reef, Daintree Rainforest, or K'gari (Fraser Island) to learn more about endangered ecosystems and how to protect them.

A Opposition Youth Member may say: Giving money to all primary schools to visit places like the Great Barrier Reef will help students understand why protecting the environment is so important.



A Government Youth Member may say: Giving all schools money to visit a World Heritage site will mean there is no money to pay for other important education supplies.



Private Members' Statement Adjournment Debate

Think of this as a free choice topic!

Students speak on <u>any</u> topic or issue that falls within either the:

- Queensland jurisdiction i.e. School, Environment, Health, Roads, Law and Order etc.
- Local jurisdiction i.e. Street, Suburb, Playround, Park, Library etc.

In the past students have spoken about the high cost of fresh fruit and vegetables, youth crime, speed limits on roads, lack of school resources or facilities, scooters and e-bikes, an endangered animal, homelessness, the Brisbane Olympics, natural disaster assistance, bullying, public transport etc.

Speech preparation tips

- Do not use palm cards.
- Print the speech on A4 paper—use large, easy-to-read font.
- Write the seat name at the top (i.e. Youth Member for Tully).
- Focus on 1 key point.
- Start with:
 - Speaker, I rise to speak on...
 - Speaker, I rise to inform the House...
 - Speaker, I draw the attention of the House...
- Conclude with *Thank-you*, *Speaker*.
