Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed legislation titled "Animal Management (Protecting Puppies) and Other Legislation". While I welcome the proposal of a mandatory breeder ID tracking system, I as a member of the public and an animal lover believe these amendments I submit the following additions to the amendments to be included:

- \* Mandatory standards and guidelines mentioned must include: regular health checks for breeding dogs, and all puppies before sale; cap
- \* The legislation should cover all dogs (no exemptions for working dogs, for example).
- \* Anyone guilty of animal welfare offences, including having unregistered breeding animals, should have their permit revoked (including
- \* Additional resources need to be made available to the RSPCA Qld or/and Queensland Police to investigate and enforce these animal welfare
- \* The sale of pets in pet shops should be banned (unless sourced from reputable shelters/rescue groups).

Labor stated they will end cruel puppy farming as one of their election promises.  
Without these above changes, Queensland's dogs are still at risk, and this promise will not be fulfilled.

Thank you again for the opportunity to raise my concerns. I look forward to the next amendment to include the above to conclusively end
