I write to say that I don't believe these changes go far enough to protect animal welfare. Please improve the bill by adopting the following points:

- 1. Standards and guidelines must include: mandatory regular health checks for breeding dogs and all puppies before sale; capping litter numbers per breeding female to a maximum of 3; mandatory desexing for puppies sold and retired breeding dogs, as well as rehoming program; adequate housing/space, exercise, enrichment allowing for normal behaviours, as well as regular human contact; mandatory record keeping; and capping total number of breeding dogs on any property to a maximum of 10.
- 2. The legislation should cover all dogs (no exemptions for working dogs, for example).
- 3. Anyone guilty of animal welfare offences, including having unregistered breeding animals, should have their permit revoked (including the associated property), strong financial penalty to act as deterrent, and animals seized.
- 4. Additional resources need to be made available to the RSPCA Qld or/and Queensland Police to investigate and enforce these animal welfare laws.
- 5. The sale of pets in pet shops should be banned (unless sourced from reputable shelters/rescue groups).
