The following issues need to be addressed:

There should be capped numbers of breeding females, even for registered breeders, to 10.

There should be capped litter numbers to 3 for each breeding female after all hereditary issues are cleared.

Compliance checks & especially spot unannounced checks

Increased funding for the RSPCA to police the rules & compliance.

Mandatory desexing of all puppies sold & retired breeding dogs.

Rehoming of all retired breeding dogs.

Banning the sale of puppies & kittens in pet stores unless from a rescue organisation where the purchaser will be vetted & not make a spur of the moment purchase.
