I fully support the proposed new laws and the need to protect native vegetation from uncontrolled land clearing for the following reasons

1. We need to protect native wildlife habitat and our iconic species such as the Koala whose habitat and numbers are in serious decline in Queensland.

2. Tree clearing has a detremental impact on the Great Barrier Reef particularly in regards to water quality and I believe all six Great Barrier Reef catchments should be protected rather than just three. The Reef is already experiencing severe bleaching and needs strong protection.
