Dear Chair and Committee Members,

Submission to Committee on Vegetation Management (Reinstatement) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2016

- The Bill is important to me and my future work as a professional in the management and health of our natural environment and us; being part of its future.
- I am concerned and have seen evidence of where tree clearing has impacts for the protection of koalas, and other threatened species in outer northern Brisbane.
- Since my childhood in Maryborough I have noticed that tree clearing near catchments can
 cause land erosion and run off into our river catchments the erosion and run off caused
 by clearing along the Great Barrier Reef catchment banks is a leading cause of negative
 impacts to our Great Barrier Reef biodiversity and its hierarchical impact on our future
 economy.
- My support for passing the Bill lies with broadening protection of riparian vegetation, especially in the Great Barrier Reef catchments of Burnett Mary, Eastern Cape York and Fitzroy Great Barrier Reef;
- Reinstates the application of the riverine protection permit framework to the destruction of vegetation in a watercourse, lake or spring; and
- Reinstates a broader requirement for environmental offsets to be required for any residual impact, not just 'significant' impacts as is currently provided for in offsets legislation (and has led to only 1 offset being registered for vegetation impacts since 2014).
