RE: Veterinarian Submission to Hendra virus Vaccine Inquiry
My name is Dr Andrew Morley, and I am a mixed practice veterinarian tocated at Moura, Queensland. I have been in veterinary practice for 38 years.

I wish to address the following Terms of Reference in the Qld Parliament's Hendra virus Vaccine Inquiry:

- The incidence and impact of adverse reactions by horses following vaccination and the reporting of adverse reactions and economic impacts of the Hendra vaccine.
- The development, trials and approval processes of the vaccine
- Who bears the risks of HeV infection and who incurs the costs and receives the benefits from each risk mitigation option.

I have done about 1100 Hendra vaccinations since it has been released with only 3 reported minor reactions, these being a small area of swelling at the vaccination site which resolved in a few days.

In my opinion the vaccine is safe with minimal reactions so the benefits far out way the risks.
Hendra disease is impossible to diagnose at the initial consultation so vaccinated horses are able to receive a more thorough investigation and treatment regime. The Workplace Health and Safety liability now lies with the veterinarian as well as the horse owner. As the Hendra Exclusion takes 2-3 days there is a long delay before the area is considered safe. We do treat non vaccinated horses but it is stressful and potentially dangerous for owners, employees, employers and our families.

Liability is now a major issue. An equestrian event that does not include a Hendra vaccination policy puts the organisers and the attending veterinarians at risk from prosecution.

If the horses are vaccinated everyone is safe, the owners, the families, the spectators and bystanders and the veterinarians.


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
