Dear Members of Queensland Parliament,

I urge you to vote in favour of container deposit legislation and to ban single use plastic bags.

I am an independent citizen who participates in many community-initiated environment protection and clean-up groups. One of my involvements - ecobarge clean seas - regularly involves trips to Whitsunday Islands and beaches where we routinely pick up tonnes of plastic and glass bottles and other plastic debris. Be sure that there is greater awareness among the population than you think - about the destruction of our environment - caused by careless citizens, overpopulation and a failure of governments to arrest these things and conserve habitats and manage climate change.
