Dear Secretary, this submission is from our Foundation, and reflects the opinions of all our members Australia wide, but I am formally writing to represent on of the two Queensland Surfrider Foundation Branches. Ours is located on the Sunshine Coast. We represent at least 10,000 local people who follow us.

This is very brief but basically, as all plastic is accumulating at an horrendous rate, and our planet cannot take any more of it, Surfrider Foundation wants all plastic bags, of any weight, banned. The heavier weight bags that were allowed in Tasmania, after the banning of the lightweight bags, are now the problem.

This includes the bags used for vegetables, meats, fish purchased etc.

Polystyrene has to be banned as well.

Single use plastic bait bags, to be banned please. My father used to buy frozen bait, wrapped in white butcher paper.

We also suggest and recommend, the phasing out of all disposable plastic straws, knives, forks, spoons, cups, plates etc, to be replaced in our society with biodegradable, and worm friendly organic contents. Potato starch, corn starch etc.

We also want The Refund on Returned containers, implemented as soon as possible.

We need education in Schools to help implement this.

There is no need for me to quote the disgusting figures of waste, and the dire effects it has on our planet. Boomerang Alliance and others supply much of these statistics for you, as do your own Scientists and researchers.

Surfrider Foundation Sunshine Coast Branch, (and our global cousins,) conduct many beach clean-ups, and we see the effects directly on marine life. I don't like having to cut fishing tackle from Pelicans, or releasing small fish trapped inside plastic coca cola bottles. Yes, I have done these things.
