In addition to our support on this bill, our committee remains committed to the importance of electrical safety in our communities. We will also continue to strongly advocate for further legislative changes that include:

- Mandatory installation of safety switches in all residential, commercial, and industrial buildings,
- Adoption by Australia in the amendment to the Australian and New Zealand Wiring Rules to align with New Zealand's standards, in the implementation of safety switches in all Queensland schools and a reduction on the threshold of circuits within schools from 30mA to 10mA, and
- Mandatory de-energisation of buildings before any work is commenced on a roof or within a ceiling space.
