This bill achieves nothing with regard to firearm safety and community safety. "Bad actors" will always get the weapon of choice and this only discriminates against law abiding citizens who may, in a transient way, not be supporters of the government of the day. Dissatisfaction as might be expressed on open media is not violence yet this proposal seeks to put it in that category even if the dissatisfaction expressed is not necessarily shared be existing firearm owners and is only by association.

There are already more than enough laws safeguarding against irresponsible firearm ownership.
