Attention: Queensland Parliamentary Committees,

I do not want an extension to the Emergency Bill (until 31st October 2022).

The Australian Bureau of Statistics shows that data for the duration of the pandemic has been grossly exaggerated in the media by our health minister and CHO.

Ending this bill will allow Queenslanders to get on with their lives and stop segregation in the community. Part of the rationale for mandates is to limit transmission of the Covid virus and protect vulnerable people at risk of severe disease. Emerging evidence has shown that two doses of the Covid vaccines provide little protection since the arrival of the attenuated Omicron variant. The lack of protection is apparent by the recent outbreak since the border opening on 17th December 2021. At that time only vaccinated people were allowed into QLD, only vaccinated people were allowed into pubs, clubs, sporting events etc. Which only highlights the ineffectiveness of the vaccines and why they should not be mandated and why extending the Emergency Bill is not required.
