Queensland Parliamentary Commitees,

I DO NOT want an extension to the Emergency Bill (until end Oct 2022).

Based on the current covid situation, and that of the last year, it is unnecessary to extend this Bill. ABS has found that **covid data has been exaggerated**, and is incomplete and misleading. Even with real, accurate data, this Emergency Bill is not required, and has not been for a while.

On January 1, 2022, The Lancet published an article which cited:

- The impact of vaccination on transmissibility of (covid) needs to be elucidated
- Community transmission in vaccinated is not statistically different to those who are unvaccinated
- Growing evidence that peak viral titres in the upper airways of the lungs and culturable virus are similar in unvaccinated and vaccinated individuals
- Equal presence of infectious virus in unvaccinated and vaccinated individuals
- No major difference in viral load between vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals

Due to this, it states "the current evidence suggests that mandatory vaccination policies might need to be reconsidered"

This Bill does not need extension. We are not in Emergency from Covid. Many to most deaths have been proven to have co-morbitities.
