I am writing in relation to the Government's proposal to extend the Emergency Bill until 31 October 2022.

I VEHEMENTLY OPPOSE this extension as a member of the Queensland public because:-

1. Numbers regarding Covid-19 data have been grossly overstated in the system - deaths have been attributed to Covid when in fact it was "with" Covid and not "by" Covid and was usually caused because of other comorbidities.
2. The full extent of adverse reactions to the vaccines have not been made public and these are grossly misrepresented and that I believe is negligent. The ingredients in the vaccines are also considered highly toxic and I believe should no longer be forced on the general public.
3. As a result of the gross negligence with regard to Nos. 1 and 2 above, mandates need to be dropped as soon as possible.
4. Mental health has been affected in both my household and of those in my family's households because of the mandates. One of my daughter's has just had her partner leave because of the stress of everything. They have a 3 year old and almost 6 month old.
5. I have lost my instrumental teaching work because I chose to be vaccine free, which under our Constitution, is something that I should be able to do and not have my ability to earn a living be affected. This has caused a depression in me that I have never experienced before and am struggling to shake. I loved my job and the children I worked with.
6. Our natural immunity is more than capable of handling this now and we should be able to do so. I am fully informed of how my body works, I take full responsibility for my own health, and am not frightened to be part of the community. This is a freedom that all Australian citizens should be afforded.
7. Being segregated from society is also something that has affected us. We haven't be able to go to a restaurant or club for meals, which has affected being able to interact with family and friends. We are now closer to retirement age and children free at home - we would love to be able to get back to being able to interact with the people we love and hope to grow old with.

I honestly believe that our State and Federal Governments' responses have far overreached what the actual situation was, especially now we have so much data over the past 2 years showing us that what we originally thought, and feared, is no longer the case. It is no longer the emergency that was perceived earlier.

Please allow our State to get on with our lives and get back to normal by NOT extending

the Emergencies Bill.
