Dear Parliament,

I wish to vehemently oppose any extension to the current State of Emergency Powers with respect to the Covid-19 Public Health Orders.

These powers have been in existence for over two years, and have caused untold damage to the health and security of all Queenslanders.

The publication of the recent study by John Hopkins University, showed that lockdowns only had a 0.2% effect on the death toll from Covid-19.

Study after study has shown that the transmission of the virus occurs whether people have had 2, 3 or in the case of Israel 4 doses of the Covid shots, and the benefits and longevity of natural immunity far outweighs anything provided by the shots. This is particularly relevant as none of the current vaccines provide protection against the Omicron variant, as they were all made for the original Wuhan strain.
