QUEENSLAND GOVERNMENT PROPOSED EXTENSION TO THE EMERGENCY
BILL TO 31 OCTOBER 2022

I strongly petition the Committee not to approve the extension for this
Emergency Bill to be extended to 31 October 2022 for the following
reasons:

- The Sars-Cov-2 vaccination rates are well above the desired percentage
- According to an announcement just [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] that the Omicron variant is "clearly
not" as threatening as the flu.
- Before the Sars-Cov-2 pandemic was declared, our Chief Medical
Officers never advised for Emergency Powers to be implemented to
"stop the spread" of the flu.
- Lockdowns cause more serious health issues than the Sars-Cov-2 virus
in all facets of our lives, including
 - An increase in mental health, especially among young people,
 - Aged Care Residents denied visitation of loved ones, causing
distress and the feeling of vulnerability and loneliness
 - Destruction of small business, thereby creating severe financial
hardship and stress and even to the degree of losing their
homes.
 - Unnecessary countless loss of jobs and careers, causing severe
financial hardship
