During the last two years I have lost 3 jobs to the mandates. One of these jobs took me over 3 yrs of study and more than 1500 unpaid work hours to acquire. I will probably never work in this career due to the state of Emergency. I know countless people who have also lost not only employment but lifelong careers.

In addition the segregation in Qld is impacting families and especially children My daughter recently won a gold medal at an international world championship event but I am unable to attend her presentation ceremony.

My oldest daughter is to be married in June , a day which will be one of the most significant days of her life , but the Emergency Bill may prevent her from celebrating it as she should.

These are just a few examples of how this Bill has impacted my family. The impact extends to so many more families .

Please , let us move forward with our lives. We have now seen that this virus has as much effect as the influenza virus. You need to allow Queenslanders to take responsibility for their own health and get on with life.
