Subject: I Do Not want an Extension to the Emergency Bill

Dear Committee Secretary,

I am writing to express my concern over the bill to extend the emergency health order for multiple reasons. I do not want an extension to the Emergency Bill.

From my research the only definition I can find for a pandemic is, a disease that spreads around the world. Not amount / percentage of deaths or serious disease.

By that definition, the flu is and had been a pandemic as long as humans have been on this earth, all year, every year. And we've managed to live quite well with things this way. Our immune systems continue to evolve as the diseases do and life goes on naturally.

You'd think for a pandemic to be declared we'd have double or ten times the normal number of deaths each year? Sadly, that doesn't seem to be the case.

Looking at the facts from the ABS data:

- over the last almost 2 years just over 270,000 people died in the Australia from all causes.
- Just over 2,600 died with or from covid. $2,600 / 270,000 = 0.96\%$, call it 1%
- Just over 90% of the 2,600 covid deaths had 3 serious underlying conditions.
- 37% died of cancer
- 12% died of heart disease
- 11% died of alzheimer's & dementia
- Around 140,000 die out of a population 25,690,000 = 0.5% (less than 1%) on a normal year.
- Of that, with 1% being covid related, that is 0.005% of the population.
- In 2019 flu killed just over 4,000, which is $4,000 / 140,000 = 2.8\%$. almost 3 times covid deaths annualised.
- The average age of people dying with / from covid is about the same average as deaths for all causes.

To summarise from the figures, we declared a pandemic for covid that was for 1% of the normal yearly deaths.

The flu in 2019 was 2.8% of the yearly deaths. Roughly 1/3 of the normal flu deaths we've declared and continue to declare a pandemic. Are you serious?

DAEN & TGA adverse reactions to the covid vaccines

- over 700 reported deaths
- around 15,000 serious adverse reactions
- around 110,000 adverse reactions

The health system is under massive pressure for resources and help.

- there are willing and able health professionals who want to work, but are unable due to these emergency health order

The education system is under pressure for resource and help.

- there are willing and able education professionals who want to work, but are unable due to these emergency health order

Other industries like, police, fire & rescue, SES (who are badly needed now with the floods) bush volunteer fire fighters, retail, food, etc etc.

Some of these resource problems come from the emergency bill. Why would we continue creating bigger problems than the very small percentage of the population, who on average are at the end of their natural life?

Yes, it is tragic and traumatic when people die. Especially for the ones that are left behind (most of us, 99.5%). But it is a very natural part of life.

I haven't even mentioned:

- the financial hardships people have faced during this,
- wasted taxpayer resources, like policing these draconian rules, issuing fines, and harassing everyday people.
- handing out fines to everyday people for wanting to make a living, not live in fear and go about life normally
- making businesses turn away people or hire extra people to enforce rules they should never have to, they are businesspeople, not police.
- increased mental health problems,
- family, friends and society segregations.
- Coercion to get the vaccine.
- Not making all the facts available for people to make informed choices
- Not allowing health professionals to voice their experiences.
- The health & government authorities not willing to work with health professionals
- The health & government authorities not presenting their modelling and justifications for these measures.
- the removal of early treatments via doctors, the very job they do, treat early and tailored to the patient they know well and prevent people from going to hospital and preventing serious cases.

This has been a campaign of bully and coercion. Not good leadership, not good management, not good collaboration, not good risk assessments and evaluations. There hasn't been a willingness to obtain as much information and early markers as possible when there is so many unknowns. To not even try to look for them is very irresponsible.

The amount of fear and panic that has been created through daily fixatedness of the number of covid cases and number of tests is terrible. We never focus every year or even test for number of colds and flu each year. It's the amount that go to hospital and die that is what we are concerned with. And a lot of those die with those systems, not from colds and flu's. There is very good evidence that stress lowers the immune systems effectiveness. The government and mainstream media have a lot to answer for in creating this state alone with vilification of the unvaccinated (only to covid). Most of the people unvaccinated to covid are vaccinated with most of the other vaccines.

I don't really recall any good normal sense messages like, eat well, exercise, well-being things like meditation, mindfulness or other similar things that are good for you overall.

The fact that an everyday person like me is even writing this email / letter speaks volumes to me. I've spent a lot of time researching and reading material that the Qld government & media haven't made available. It seems via your actions you think people can't deal with the realities of everyday life. I feel very sorry for the elected and public officials' people, if you really think that the people of this great state and country are that weak and frail and unable to comprehend things. Added to the fact you are not open and honest with the public with the information and modelling you have also speaks volumes.

I implore you, see sense, look at the facts, let things go back to normal. The ridiculous measures haven't worked to stop covid, just like the flu it goes around the planet every year.

As it is we have huge debts that must be paid off via likely higher taxes in the future plus savings that were wiped out must be accumulated again, it takes time. How much worse do you want to make it?

Inflation is really starting to kick in, the official measures don't reflect the cost of living for the average person, nor do they factor in lost income and used savings from pandemics. Life is getting harder to make ends meet. By continuing like this for another 6 months you are contributing to this even more.
