## To Whom It May Concern

I do not support the further extension of the operation of essential public health measures implemented to facilitate Queensland's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

There is no longer a pandemic. Statistically, the numbers suggest that SARS CoV 2 is now at endemic phase. Hospital admissions are well below modelling, infections are well below modelling, the vaccine is not preventing spread and will not protect against further weakened strains. The general public should now be able to manage their own health without interference by the government.

Vaccine mandates need to go as we know, and is evidenced by the numbers, that the vaccine does not prevent spread. Those who are high risk for the disease cam now safely self-manage their own risk and those at low risk should be able to get back to work and back to life. Vaccine mandates are no longer medically necessary.
