**TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN — PLEASE SAY NO TO EXTENDING THE
EMERGENCY BILL**

I am quite perturbed by the current discussion in the Queensland Parliament regarding the Extension of Emergency Powers.

I find this extension total over-reach and totally unnecessary for the following reasons.

- There has been a big push by government for 2 vaccines per person plus boosters. Reality is, whether one has had the vaccine or not, you can still get the virus and pass on the virus. Natural immunity and good health practices have not been promoted, nor has any early treatment which is unprecedented.
- Sadly, people have passed away with COVID-19 and from COVID-19 which we have heard about relentlessly but only recently have we heard that most had up to four co-morbidities. Have we been told the truth?
