I call upon the committee to conclude the temporary measures including extraordinary regulations and statutory instruments associated with COVID -19 measures which expire on 30 April 2022.

Our citizens have demonstrated their compliance and now is the time for the Government to demonstrate trust. In SE Queensland we are experiencing trauma and every person who is capable of giving assistance should be able to do so.

The rules which allow an unvaccinated first responder to give CPR to an accident victim while a negative tested unvaccinated teacher cannot return to work when we have over 90% fully vaccinated seems ridiculous.

My daughter is the Guidance Officer for [REDACTED] She had an adverse response to her first vaccination. She has medical support confirming that she has a medical contraindication but despite this she is not allowed to return to work at a school that has been highlighted in the media as being totally desperate for staff. This is a ridiculous situation.

To continue with these regulations smacks of authoritarianism. The measures have achieved what they set out to do. Now is the time to revert to normal measures.
