RE: PUBLIC HEALTH AND OTHER LEGISLATION (EXTENSION OF EXPIRING PROVISIONS) AMENDMENT BILL 2022.

Dear Committee Secretary,

Please see below points outlining my <u>formal objection</u> to the bill "Public Health and other legislation (extension of expiring provisions) amendment bill 2022"

Excerpt below from the above mentioned bill explanatory notes

"As at 16 February 2022, the World Health Organization reported a total of 414,525,183 confirmed positive COVID-19 cases reported globally. The Australian Government Department of Health reported 2,609,599 confirmed COVID-19 cases, including 4,732 deaths in Australia. In Queensland, there have been 507,746 confirmed cases of COVID-19, with 399 deaths relating to COVID-19 being Queensland residents."

- How can the Queensland parliament warrant the extension of the expiring provisions under the guise of a "State of emergency when COVID-19 has a mortality rate in Australia of 0.0018% using the data quoted in the explanatory notes for the bill?
- How can the Queensland parliament warrant the extension of the expiring provisions under the guise of a "State of emergency when **COVID-19 has a mortality rate in Queensland of 0.00078%** using the data quoted in the explanatory notes for the bill?
- Further to the points stated above, as at the 7th February 2022, the requirement to check in was removed. From the 4th March, the requirement to wear masks will be removed and the unvaccinated (against COVID-19 with an experimental drug that is still in a trial phase and has no long term data regarding adverse affects) being allowed to attend hospitality venues.
- Theses points suggest that the risk from COVID-19 is at a low to negligible level, for both contraction of and sickness from.
- When will the Queensland state parliament acknowledge the will of the people and drop all COVID-19 related mandates that are causing segregation and stigmatisation of the people of Queensland?
 - ~2 million Australian people converged on Australian Parliament house on Saturday the 12th of February 2022. This is unprecedented in all of Australian history. When is enough, enough the people of Queensland and Australia have had enough of this this tyrannical and draconian dictatorship which we have all be living under for the past two years and you the politicians are required to follow the will of the people.
