Re: Making a Submission to a Committee Inquiry of an Extension to the Emergency Bill (until 31st October 2022).

To the *Community Support and Services Committee* that I do not support the extension of the state of emergency or the Public Health and other Legislation (Extension of Expiring Provisions) Amendment Bill of 2022.
