As a resident of Queensland I do not support the extension to the Emergency Bill.

The medical segregation of the vaccine mandates is affecting people's daily lives, they cannot celebrate special events with family and friends outside of their own homes. Most recently on holiday our group was broken up because we could not enter a public water park and the children desperately wanted to enjoy the day with their friends. People are losing their jobs or giving up careers that they have studied and given their lives to because they are being forced by a government to give up their sovereignty over their own bodies!
