I Lindy Williams, [REDACTED] **DO NOT** support the BILL nor the extension of the state of emer

- There is abundant evidence world wide that stringent government controls DO NOT translate to better outcomes. I draw your attention to the data from Sweden and Japan.
- Extending the state of emergency is no longer about managing a crisis but is more about retaining power over the people and continuing the mandates and medical discrimination with these vaccines which are still experimental and only have Emergency Use Authorisation and no long term safety data. Further more, evidence shows their efficacy is questionable.
- Only under a State of Emergency could censorship of prominent Doctors and the banning of proven effective treatments be possible. If the Government was at all concerned about 'Public Safety' why were Ivermectin and Hydroxychloroquine removed from use and Doctors threatened with deregistration if they prescribe either of these PBS approved drugs.
