Dear Committee,

RE: PUBLIC HEALTH AND OTHER LEGISLATION (EXTENSION OF EXPIRING PROVISIONS) AMENDMENT BILL 2022 (BILL)

I am writing to formally advise of my strong objection to this Bill and do not support any extension of the state of emergency.

The potential for continued discrimination via these emergency powers is unacceptable to any democratic society.

The opportunity for free speech, the right to peaceful assembly, the right to work, bodily autonomy, and government transparency have all been negatively impacted by these emergency powers and mandates.

The negatives of these emergency powers and mandates and the pressure they are placing on Queenslanders through lost jobs and a pressured healthcare system, far outweigh the health impacts of Covid, as truthful scientific data shows.

- » The predicted and reported severity of the Disease was/has been grossly overestimated.
- » Healthy people are not at high risk of complications from SARS-COV-2 (Virus) if they do catch it.
- » You can naturally boost your immune system to lessen symptoms if you do come into contact with the Virus.
- » Healthy people are not spreaders of disease.
