PUBLIC HEALTH AND OTHER LEGISLATION (EXTENSION OF EXPIRING PROVISIONS) AMENDMENT BILL 2022 (BILL)

Dear Committee Secretary,

I would like to advise the Community Support and Services Committee that I do not support the extension of the state of emergency or the Public Health and other Legislation (Extension of Expiring Provisions) Amendment Bill of 2022.

These powers allow power hungry leaders to abuse the trust of the Queensland people and must be ended. There is not (and arguable has never been) an emergency that would require this kind of undemocratic legislation to continue.

This bill would allow for the unacceptable continuation of trauma to Queensland families who have lost business, livelihoods, educational opportunities, social connections and so much more. People are ready to rebuild but are not being allowed to under the weight of government led fearmongering and the encroachmentl of their basic human rights.

The evidence is stacking up against governments who have implemented draconian measures.
