Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to inform you that I do not want an extension to the Emergency Bill until 31st October 2022, as I do not believe it is necessary.

Based on the numbers of deaths in Queensland from COVID, and not people who have died with COVID (who have had pre-existing conditions), I do not believe that this warrants an extension to the emergency powers. The ABS clearly shows that the numbers of deaths from COVID were exaggerated. Only 2,639 deaths in the whole of Australia have occurred from the start of the 'pandemic'until 31January 2022 with the majority of these deaths being in those over the age of 80 years. Only 8.6% of deaths had COVID only, listed as the cause of death. As of 31 January, only 69 people have died from COVID, and yet infection rates were at their highest according to data released daily.

While any death is regrettable, in the same period of time, there have been more deaths from cancer, diabetes, heart disease and a number of other conditions. More people die of the flu and pneumonia each year, than those who have died of COVID.

Internationally, the UK and many European countries have dropped their mandates and vaccine passports. Australia needs to follow suit and drop all mandates and vaccine passports. They are not required. The government needs to stop their fear campaign and get on with helping the people of Australia, not dividing them. .

Listen to the people, drop the mandates and do not extend the Emergency Bill. It is not needed. The fear mongering and lying to the people of Australia has to stop. The people who have caused devastation to lives of thousands of people in this country who have lost jobs, lost connections with their friends and family etc, need to be held accountable.

STOP the Emergency Bill. Listen to your people.
