concerned by the proposed extension to the Emergency Bill and request further inquiry and response to the following discrepancies:

a) The best current local and global scientific evidence seems in conflict with a continued State of Emergency with regard to COVID-19. Please publish the evidential basis for the extension of the Emergency Bill taking into consideration the latest local and global findings.

b) The original premise of introducing the bill and emergency powers was based on a risk assessment preventing greater harm to the community expected from an unmanaged pandemic. Please provide the latest detailed risk assessments of the consequences of either a continuation of the proposed bill, or the cessation of the bill.

Without (a) & (b) I am unable to ascertain if the proposed extension is justified and whether it will protect and benefit myself and the wider Qld community or provide greater harm.

c) The legal basis and relevance extending the laws. The Federal Registration of Legislation guidelines, which are representative of the Commonwealth of Australia Laws, Acts and Statutes, has not made any provision or proposal for any current or future mandatory vaccination program within the borders of the Commonwealth of Australia jurisdiction. This is important and fundamental in relation to the above bill, as the very introduction of the bill results in the enforcement of mandatory workplace vaccination requirements. As a result, the bill may be in contravention of the Federal and Commonwealth laws of right to voluntary vaccination. Should the bill be renewed without explanation and/or settlement of the above discrepancies, then you and the responsible members of the Queensland Parliament may be in breach of the Federal and Commonwealth of Australia laws in relation to right to voluntary vaccination, by encouraging and making allowances for the enforcement of mandatory workplace vaccination.

This notice of submission has been formulated to inform you of your duties and responsibilities to the Citizens of the Commonwealth of Australia. If you choose to ignore this notification, you are in acceptance of any resultant legal or lawful actions submitted and pursued by or on behalf of the Citizens of the Commonwealth of Australia.

Therefore, as a Citizen of the Commonwealth of Australia, I hereby declare the above proposed bill be revoked or withdrawn when the current expiration date of the bill ends on the 30 April 2022.
