Dear Committee Secretary,

I write personally to state my strong objection to the proposed Extension of Expiring Provisions Amendment Bill 2022.

I am 75 years of age, have lived and worked successfully in Queensland and all over Australia; have been a model citizen and contributed substantially to the Performing Arts in Queensland. I have not suffered any illness for most of my life and now, because I have read widely about the Covid inoculations and decided to exercise my right to refuse this intervention until enough time had passed to assess the data and decide whether my immune system was a better risk than the medicine itself, I have been subjected to the most egregious treatment by the Queensland Government and my fellow citizens. This medical apartheid is a shameful blot on our state and our country, especially considering the vaccines have not prevented the spread of infection or transmission; and the past two years of government overreach has caused terrible harm to individuals, businesses, school children and elderly citizens, not to mention breaking the trust between individuals and institutions in our state. An extension of this Public Health Bill to 31st October 2022 to support another 6 months of a State of Emergency is unnecessary. There is an obvious abatement of the illness; we need to be able to take control of our own lives and health from now on, and remove all the constraining mandates and rulings of the last two years once and for all.
