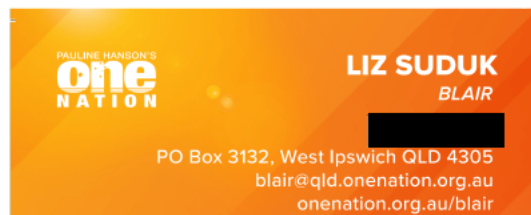

Dear Committee,

I wish to register my objection to the extension of

- amendments to the *Public Health Act 2005* to increase powers for emergency officers and the Chief Health Officer to limit, or respond to, the spread of COVID-19 in Queensland, support testing and quarantine requirements and authorize other public health measures;
- amendments to the *Corrective Services Act 2006*, *Disaster Management Act 2003* and *Mental Health Act 2016* to support the public health response;
- a head of power in the *COVID-19 Emergency Response Act 2020* to make regulations to facilitate transitional arrangements for the temporary framework.

This was meant to be temporary – it has been going for over two years. This Government has not listened to the people and put thousands out of work due to bill.

Whilst I understand the Queensland Government has no intention of doing what the people want, there is no logical or fair reason why they need to extend this declaration. We the people, have done everything they wanted us to do and still our freedoms have been not been returned.

As one of the only checks against the Government, I implore you to advise against this extension. Queensland has had enough of government over reach. We need to move past this and try to get Queensland back on track.
