

Submission in response to

Public Health and Other Legislation (Extension of Expiring Provisions) Amendment Bill 2022

I do not believe an extension of emergency powers in response to Covid 19 is necessary.

There is no longer an emergency. Covid is here and should now be treated like flu which actually has a higher death rate,
