Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to inform you that I do not want an Extension to the Emergency Bill (until October 2022).

I am a Home Care Worker and due to the current vaccine mandates I have been on unpaid leave since the 12th of November 2021. I love my job and love assisting the aged members of our community, but I have not been allowed to work, unless I receive 3 doses now of a provisionally approved Covid-19 vaccination, with proven adverse side effects in some people, some with fatal consequences, and no data of long term effects.

As a person who has received a positive Covid-19 PCR test and experienced Covid-19 firsthand, I cannot justify receiving an untrustworthy vaccination for an illness that I experienced as a very mild flu.

As per the usual way the immune system works, having experienced Covid-19 I should now have protection against Covid-19 via natural immunity. However, I have seen several doctors who all refuse to sign a temporary medical exemption, afraid of the ramifications for them if they do so, therefore I still remain unable to work in my role.

As well as this, due to restrictions for the unvaccinated, I have not been able to visit my grandfather in his nursing home for his 95th birthday, nor attend my sister's birthday dinner at a restaurant, or enjoy special outings with my husband and children.

I need the current vaccine mandates and the restrictions for the unvaccinated to be dropped. I need my job back and my life back. There are a lot of people in this same position as me. Please consider us when you are voting on the Extension to the Emergency Bill.
