The State Government has not provided sufficient data and other relevant evidence, relating to the justification of the extension of the Bill, to the people of Queensland. There has indeed, been a complete lack of proof and data provided by Qld Health, CHO or members of Parliament, to those who have repeatedly requested it.

I and the people of Queensland, have not received a detailed update of the risks and/or consequences of, either a continuation of the proposed Bill, or the cessation of the Bill. Further to this, there has been no provision of sufficient evidence relating to the justification and/or lawful relevance of the Bill, to the people of Queensland.

As a result; I am unable to ascertain how the above proposed Bill could benefit or prevent any meaningful actions

Recent data that has now been released by the ABS shows that fatalities due to COVID-19 have been exaggerated. The reprehensible fact appears to be, that citizens of our State and nation have been misled and the level of the Health Emergency was not at that of which we were warned it would be.

Federal Registration of Legislation guidelines, which are representative of the Commonwealth of Australia Laws, Acts and Statutes; has not made any provision or proposal, for any current or future mandatory vaccination program, within the borders of the Commonwealth of Australia jurisdiction.
