SUBMISSION TO THE QUEENSLAND PARLIAMENTARY COMMITTEE INQUIRY INTO EXTENDING QUEENSLAND'S 'STATE OF EMERGENCY'

To the Committee Secretary,

re: PUBLIC HEALTH AND OTHER LEGISLATION (EXTENSION OF EXPIRING PROVISIONS) AMENDMENT BILL 2022 (BILL)

My position on this matter is: I am AGAINST the extension of the "State of Emergency" in Qld.

My reasons for this are numerous, and I am aware that much of it is already covered in detail in many other submissions, but in brief:
