Dear Committee Members,

I wish to express my opposition to the extension of the temporary measures to 31 October in the following Acts:

- * the Public Health Act 2005
- * the Corrective Services Act 2006, Disaster management Act 2003, Mental Health Act 2016,
- * Covid 19 Emergency Response Act 2020

Please consider the following:

- * The Australian Bureau of Statistics data which was recently released states that covid related deaths (2639) that occurred in Australia to 31 January 2022 accounted for only 1% of all deaths during that time and that the majority of those deaths also had underlying causes and the median age was over 80 years.
- * Covid is listed as the 38th cause of death in Australia
- * The Omicron variant is mild & has provided extra immunity for those who contracted it or were exposed to it.
- * Queensland has a very high level of vaccination 92%
- * Many Nations around the world with lower levels of vaccination are now treating Covid as endemic & have revoked Covid restrictions & mandates (eg UK, Ireland, Sweden, Denmark, Norway).

I therefore believe that it would GREATLY benefit the people & the economy of Queensland to treat Covid as endemic moving forward, rather than extend any emergency powers.
