I DO NOT want an Extension to the Emergency Bill.

The continued breach of Human Rights, demands hard evidence to support that it is warranted.

There is many different sources of data and reputable studies that show The main risk to public health from covid 19 is diminishing. The severity of the Covid 19 Omnicron strain is much less than initially portrayed and is declining.

Take notice that, there is evidence to suggest that the agencies, persons and associations providing public health advice have been doing so using data that has been misinterpreted.

The latest Data from the Australian Beureau of Statistics paints a very different picture, to what has been previously portrayed and used to declare current Health Emergencies.

There is sugestions that the agencies, persons or associations providing public health advice have conflicts of interest in this matter.

Take Notice that, it is the responsibility of the QLD government to prudently investigate all relevant information, including any possible conflicts of interest that may inhibit the proper representation of the information considered when implementing public health emergency declarations.

In order to validate the evidence that is required to continue breaching the Human rights of the people of QLD.

Take notice that in order to justify continued breaches of Human rights, there must be irrefutable evidence that the information that is used to justify this decision is true, correct and considered appropriately.

Statistically speaking this is some information from the ABS website:

Of the 2,556 Covid deaths 69.5% or 1,176 already had underlying “pre-existing” chronic conditions.

8.6% or 220 died of Covid alone.

There were 21.9% or 560 reported with “casual sequence of events only” that arguably could be Covid related but other events occurred to make causation difficult.

At best only 220 or 8.6% are directly due to Covid. This is not a majority of the 2,556.

Take notice that the real risk of Covid 19, must be demonstrated to outweigh the risk to the community by continuing with policies such as mandatory vaccines for employment and other activities. It must be considered that many Queensland's have and will continue to suffer from huge emotional, physiological and financial loss from continued abuse of their Human rights.

Take notice that there are many studies that suggest that the risk of reported adverse health events from Covid 19 vaccines is greater than the reported benefit of these vaccines. All information available must be considered and validated prior to approving any further breaches of Human Rights.
