Dear Community Support and Services Committee,

I am writing to inform you that I do not want the extension to the emergency bill extended until the 31st Oct 2022.

It has come to my attention that there is currently consideration/discussion of extending the emergency powers within Queensland, potentially until the end of October. This causes me great concern, as the government overreach threatens to drag on even further. By the very nature of its name, emergency powers should be reserved for use in an emergency. By definition, most dictionaries I consulted gave an almost identical explanation, an emergency is a sudden, serious, urgent, sometimes unforeseen, situation that requires IMMEDIATE attention. The Covid 19 situation, having continued for over 2 years, now falls beyond the scope of emergency. Once the immediate risk has passed the situation ceases to be an emergency.
