> Please note that opinions are not sufficient grounds to imply compatibility with the human rights act and the consultation of a sufficiently broader scientific community including independent review that considers evidence based research and broader expert opinion is required before determining the suitability of any state of emergency extension.

> I propose there should be no extension to the state of emergency until such a time that the broader scientific community is consulted with greater transparency involved in decisions of extension.
