There is the potential for continued medical discrimination via these emergency powers and this is grossly UNACCEPTABLE in any democratic society.


The original Emergency Bill was granted based on a death rate from the Alpha and Delta variants. And the case numbers have indicated that the original modelling was substantially overinflated.
