I have recently moved to Moorooka and am stoked to be in your area. I previously lived in Woolloongabba, and had 2 rent increases within the past year, and finally when the lease came up, the sharehouse where I lived couldn't renew as we could no longer afford the area. That brought me to Moorooka, a suburb I have been actively engaged in for the past 2.5 years and love. There's a true sense of community here, that is relatively easy to get involved in; these aspects of community feel stronger in Moorooka than any other suburb I have lived in in Brisbane to date. But there's a problem.

Locals are getting pushed out because they can no longer afford the rent or find a place to live, not just in Moorooka, but all around brisbane. In the relationships I hold through my participation in the Moorooka Social Space, this year there have been countless individuals and 4 families (some of those single mothers with children) who have been:

- unable to renew leases,
- -sign a new lease for a different residence in the area they have lived for years or decades, -have had to be looking for rentals 4-5 months prior to leases being up for renewal in the knowledge that their rent is to be increased over what they can afford, only to not be able to find anything affordable and having to leave the suburb
- have had to take on leases above what they can afford due to the severe shortage of rentals available, desperation and fear of being homeless -have rent increased despite necessary repairs and maintenance being conducted on the dwelling -many people have been unable to find accomodation anywhere, and have had to spend several weeks in cars or on sofas until accomodation has come up.
- -a single man in his 60's had his rental sold and he had to leave, he lived in his car for a few weeks, then on someone's couch for a few weeks, nothing came up for rent that a single person could afford. I think he's still squatting in the bush somewhere in NSW.

Those are just the people that already lived in Moorooka. And I've had 4 people seperate to that use my place as temporary accommodation while they apply for upwards of 20 rentals, until they are successful.

In relation to the Social Space, people are leaning on us harder than ever before for many of their meals per week, and have less to contribute to the donation box, which pays for all the food.

This is at a time when our volunteers move out of the area and struggle with paying their own rent, therefore having to work more and reducing the time they could offer to the community.

I miss my community members that have had to leave. I worry about those that I will lose in the coming months.
