However it seems to be very long on all the penalties and processes if one transgresses but very short on how to identify SCL - the most important reason for this legislation

The criteria suggested are a very basic selection of a enormous array of criteria and past work and publications which should have done much of this work for you

- This suggests the technical people you have accessed have not known or put forward much of the above
- Thus this legislation is severely flawed before it starts and thus will be sub-optimal and fail its supposed purpose

May I suggest its stakeholder consultation was poor

None of the peak committees which I am a member of were consulted A historical cropping history is a poor criteria to chose SCL and would be very restrictive and would thus fail to select potentially important SCL for the future

The terminology of rigid/non-rigid soils is a strange one and meaningless to all farmers

SCL is more than cropping or cultivation

How does this legislation conflict with the Vegetation Act which alienated much potential SCL

There is a fair bit to read through but it does not fill me with confidence that future generations are looked after
