I have great concerns over the changes proposed for homeschooling children and families. In particular the proposed change to ensure all children are reported against the Australian Curriculum. As a state school teacher, I see first-hand how the Australian Curriculum is NOT allowing children to succeed to their full potential in a mainstream school setting.
