Home-schooling allows us to tailor our children's education to their needs. This new bill will take away our ability for a high level education. The current school system does not allow for an individual approach to our students and home-schooling does. Forcing the national curriculum on homeschoolers does not serve any benefit to the homeschooled student but only serves to ease government department's paperwork load.

I would like to see the research that you have gathered that explains how this change will benefit homeschoolers and also the evidence and studies showing that the National Curriculum is serving Australia well. We left a system that is continually failing students and have since been thriving at home.
