## **Submitter Comments:**

I am writing to express my concern regarding the new bill that proposes homeschooling families in Australia must follow the Australian curriculum. While I understand the intention behind this bill, I believe it raises several important issues that need to be addressed. Since embarking on this journey, she has flourished, enjoying the freedom to pursue her interests and cultivate a love for learning. At just 14 years old, she has even taken the initiative to enroll in a university short course, a significant step toward her future career aspirations. It is clear that the flexibility of homeschooling has enabled her to thrive academically and personally. Any requirement to adhere strictly to a curriculum that does not align with her needs or aspirations would undoubtedly hinder her progress and potential for success. I urge you to reconsider this bill and to consider the concerns of homeschooling families. Instead of imposing a one-size-fits-all approach, I encourage you to support policies that promote flexibility and choice in education, while ensuring that all children have access to a high-quality education that meets their individual needs.
