The proposed conditions related to child-led, self-led, and project-based learning do not align with the best interests of my children or with providing them a high-quality education through natural learning. Of particular concern are the proposed changes regarding the suitable environment for educational families and the vague criteria for interpretation. Additionally, the imposition of the national curriculum fails to accommodate the unique needs of project-based learning families. Furthermore, the requirement for reporting evidence without adequate support or compensation for families is unreasonable. We are not formal educational institutions or paid educators; we are families making decisions based on what we believe is best for our children. It is imperative that you provide evidence demonstrating how these changes will benefit educational families and not adversely impact us. Until such evidence is provided, we do not accept these proposed changes. As a sovereign family, my children, who are Indigenous Australians, adhere to our own high-quality standards of interest-based learning. We do not require excessive monitoring or interference from governmental bodies. Therefore, we reject these proposed changes and assert that you do not have the authority to impose them. This communication serves as a formal declaration of our opposition to the proposed changes. I Danielle (last name), do not approve of these changes described above within the Education (General Provisions) And Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2024. I formally reject these changes. Homeschooling is for children that cannot deal with society You bullying and coercing them to do something they are uncomfortable with makes you personally liable and accountable for their potential suicide And you will be held accountable in your private capacity You are without the right. This is universal decree.
