I am writing to object to the proposed changes to homeschooling in Queensland. These changes are a complete overreach by the government and they have no right to decide what and how my child learns. As a father to a current homeschooling family, these changes add no benefits to my child. I would like to know how planning and reporting across ALL subjects of the national curriculum assists in the learning of my child? This defeats the purpose of homeschooling.
