Since home-schooling she has been able to significantly improve her mental health and she is learning far more now than she ever was within the education system.

After being told that the education system was what was best for my child, it turns out I was right and it was not.

If a parent decides to home school, it is for many reasons, none of which are to the detriment of the child.
